To begin your application process, below are details outlining the overall program and expectations of LPC.

HISTORY:

Founded in 1991, Leadership Pickens County (LPC) is a nine-month leadership development program devoted to strengthening and guiding our community leaders. Since its inception, 600 local leaders have graduated from the program and continue their commitment to the growth and development of Pickens County.

PURPOSE:

LPC is a countywide program designed to help develop informed, committed and qualified leaders for Pickens County. By taking an intensive look into the issues affecting our county, LPC prepares and motivates participants to provide quality, dynamic leadership within the area. LPC also provides an opportunity to build long-lasting networks and relationships.

GOALS:

- Develop a greater awareness of community issues by examining major systems or sectors of our community
- Challenge participants to respond to social and economic needs of our community
- Develop a common spirit among participants which will provide common ground for working together on present and future community needs
- Enhance leadership skills and qualities in participants which lead to creative and insightful community solutions
- Ensure broad-based future leadership for our community by engaging leaders with diverse social, civic and professional backgrounds

PROGRAM FORMAT:

LPC begins in September with a mandatory two-day retreat focused on team building and leadership development exercises. After the opening retreat, full-day follow-up sessions are held once a month to explore issues and topics important to Pickens County. Session topics include education, economic development, local government, state government, business & infrastructure, healthcare, community services, communications, and healthcare. Sessions offer class members an opportunity to meet community leaders in each of the areas, hear from the experts on various topics and visit sites throughout the county. In addition, the class is required to complete a community service project. The program concludes in May with a class graduation.

PARTICIPATION:

LPC is open to anyone who lives or works in Pickens County. Anyone may apply directly or be nominated by an employer, a local chamber of commerce, or LPC graduate. Applications are available at each chamber office (Clemson, Easley and Pickens) and on the chamber's respective website.

PROGRAM EXPECTATIONS:

Expectations of LPC participation include:

- Mandatory attendance at the two-day Orientation Retreat
- No more than two (2) absences from monthly follow-up sessions
- Involvement/engagement in planning and implementing the class project
- Active and respectful dialogue with classmates and speakers related to session topics
- Attendance at the LPC class graduation celebration

TUITION INFORMATION

Tuition for Leadership Pickens County is \$800, which covers all materials, food, transportation, and any other related program costs. *LPC participants will incur an additional cost for lodging at the State Government session held in Columbia; however, a block room rate will be offered to minimize that cost.*

There is an incentive for sending more than one participant per year/company or in sending participants for consecutive years.

- Send one participant this year, tuition is \$800. Send two participants this year, tuition is \$700 per person. Send three participants this year, tuition is \$600 per person. In subsequent years, eligible for \$600 price for one or more participant until company misses a year of participation.
- Send one participant first year, tuition is \$800. Send one participant the second consecutive year, tuition is \$700. Send one participant for third consecutive year, tuition is \$600. After three consecutive years of participation, tuition is capped at \$600, as long as business continues to send participants annually.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Currently, there are three sponsoring chambers for Leadership Pickens County (Clemson Area Chamber, Greater Easley, and Greater Pickens). CLASS PROJECT

As part of the Leadership Pickens County experience, each class is required to complete a community service project, which must be implemented no later than your final follow-up session date in early May. The class will seat a small committee that will meet with the LPC Board of Regents to present an overview of your proposed class project. Traditionally, this presentation takes place no later than early December. While the project committee will coordinate the process to research, identify, and organize the project, it is expected that ALL class members will be involved with identifying the project, as well as the implementing the project.

During some of the full-day sessions, the agenda will allow for discussion related to your class project. However, in order to successfully develop and implement your class project, you will most likely need to schedule meetings outside the time frame of the scheduled follow-up sessions. The scope and timeline of the class project will determine the number and frequency of these extra meetings. The class members will collectively decide how to plan and manage these meetings.
